Audition Requirements

1. Your Drama teacher must certify that you have received at least 5 hours of instruction in Theatre Arts.

2. You must stand on the stage and speak loudly enough to be heard clearly in the last row of the theater. **As part of your audition, you must read loudly, clearly and with expression one of the poems on the back of this page:**

3. You must choose a character from a short list, develop the character in your imagination, then play that character on the stage using attitude, movement and speech.
